2.	Regulation amendments	The Board, at its meeting held on 22 November 2022, approved the following amendments to S Regulations: Regulation S(C)51 TO: 51. MOVING SEND AROUND. Whilst heeling the handler sends the dog clockwise around behind them as though in a right finish, the handler may pause to allow the dog to regain the heel position, as the dog returns to heel the dog must be allowed to regain the heel position before the handler and dog heel forward. The dog does not sit. This should be a flowing movement. (Deletion struck through. Insertion in bold) MOVING SEND AROUND AROUND Regulation K3e. Rally Warrants TO: A Rally Warrant will be issued on application by the registered owner at the time of qualification in respect of a dog that has obtained the following: (1) a Rally title at all levels (2) a Rally Level 6 Excellent title (3) an additional 3 excellent scores at Level 6, which must be gained after 1 January 2021 The title "RW" may be used after the name of the dog on competition entries

	Regulation S(B)5.f. TO: In Levels 1 and 2 when an exercise requires more than one sign to complete, each exercise sign should be listed on the Judge's score sheet. Each sign should be scored separately. In Level 3 and above where an exercise requires multiple signs, this is scored as 1 exercise on the judges score sheet. 	Regulation S22.c. TO: All dogs must enter and leave the judging ring on lead. When in use, one end of the lead must be attached to a ring on the dog's collar and the other should be held in the handler's hand(s), except for when performing Bonus Exercises 4 or 5 where the handler has chosen for their dog to drag the lead. (Insertion in bold) (Effective 1 January 2024)	
	Regulation S20.b.(3) TO: Have attended completed a Kennel Club Rally Regulations and Judging Procedure Seminar and passed the Regulations and Judging Procedure examination. (Deletion struck through. Insertion in bold) (Effective 1 January 2024)

6.	The use of the Incident Book	The Working Party wished to remind all participants that the Incident Book should be used to record any occurrence at a competition which was out of the ordinary, even if resolved on the day. Reporting such matters allowed the office to maintain a record of such incidents should it be required for later use. Chief Stewards would also be reminded, through training courses, of the purpose and correct use of the incident book.	All to note
7.	Tracking devices	The Working Party discussed the use of tracking devices on collars and did not see any reason for the tracking device to be worn whilst the dog was competing. Note: 'Regulation S22.h. states: 'Dogs must compete in a buckle or snap collar. Collars may have tags on them. Decorations and/or costumes, harnesses, slip leads, check and half-check collars are not allowed. A medicated collar may also be worn in the ring.'	Competitors and Judges to note
8.	10-Year Anniversary of Kennel Club Rally	2023 saw the 10 th anniversary of the first Kennel Cub licensed rally competition. A display was undertaken in the main ring at Crufts incorporating several of the original competitors and judges. A 3-day show was held over Easter to celebrate the anniversary.	All to note
